

## **Hospitalfield Guidance on Funding for the Interdisciplinary Programme**

The Interdisciplinary Programme at Hospitalfield is an international residency open to applications from international and UK-based artists, writers, architects, producers, dancers, choreographers, curators, designers, educators, researchers and those developing their working lives within the scope of contemporary cultural practices. A highly international part of Hospitalfield's programme, it is open to those working across the arts who recognise that they require some time and space to focus on the development of their work.

Residents have private bedrooms, full catering of meals, optional facilitated sessions with the programme team and a peer group of practitioners to work alongside.

**There is a subsidised cost to attend this residency which in 2021 is £650 for the two weeks.**

It is possible to raise funds from trusts, public bodies and foundations in order to attend the Interdisciplinary Residency at Hospitalfield.

If you are offered a place on the programme, Hospitalfield will provide you with a letter of support detailing the residency and the subsidised 'In Kind' equivalent amount which you can detail in your application for the funding.

### **1. Identifying possible funders to apply to:**

Depending on where you live and at what stage in your practice you are, there are trusts, foundations and national organisations who are able to fund you to undertake a residency. We advise carefully checking the application deadlines and also the eligibility criteria. We have details of possible funders with a focus on Scotland which we can share if you email [programme@hospitalfield.org.uk](mailto:programme@hospitalfield.org.uk).

### **2. Your project:**

You have already outlined your plans for your residency in your application to Hospitalfield. We suggest revising your application to suit the purpose of the funder that you are applying to.

### **3. What you can apply for funding for:**

Carefully read the guidelines for the funding organisations and decide whether you would be eligible. Check what they do and do not fund.

You may be able to apply for funds to support:

The cost of the residency (£650)

Travel to/from the residency

Materials / software / equipment required for the work to be undertaken

A fee for your time (not all funders support this)

It is often advisable to also include in your budget the in-kind support. For example:

Subsidy amount (£539)

Your time (x days of your time you spend on your practice)

### **4. Let Hospitalfield know**

If you plan to apply for funds to attend the residency, please let us know in the application form when you send your application. We will therefore ensure to provide you with a letter of support upon offering you a place on the residency.
